Parish Council News

The new inhibitors have been installed at either end of the Westminster Field path from Station Road to the field. These are intended to stop the unauthorised access of horses and vehicles.

The Old Fire Station has been granted planning permission for 4 x two bedroom and 2 x one-bedroom apartments.

Criminal damage was caused to the Westminster Field vehicle entrance gate, and this has now been replaced with a more robust design.

SGN are carrying out essential gas network upgrades in the villages. This will involve some road closures. For up-to-date details please visit our website.

You can find details of the Parish Council statutory regulations including Standing Orders, Statement of internal control. Annual Governance Statement, Accounting Statements and Internal Annual Audit report on our website.

There was a report of anti-social behaviour in 100 Year Wood for an incident of setting fire to habitation. This was reported to the police.

Please ensure that all incidents of ASB are reported to the police. The police stated at the Parish meetings that there is a low level of reporting of ASB in the area. This includes catapults, nuisance bikes and vehicle crime.

A short verbal poll on the need for a printed Newsletter showed that over 62% wanted to keep the format as it is currently.

Kent County Council Highways have asked the Parish Council to update their 'Highways Improvement Plan' (HIP) for 2025-26. This helps to identify and prioritise any problems with roads within the Horton Kirby & South Darent Parish boundary. We asked for your views, and we will update you when the report is completed.

If you want to improve a junction, change speed limits or request new signs, lines or traffic calming [find out what to do](#).

Once KCC assess your enquiry, they will take the appropriate action. They aim to fix:

- dangerous faults within 2 hours
- safety hazards within 7 days
- routine faults such as streetlights, potholes and soft landscape issues within 28 days, unless there is a more serious problem which could take longer
- traffic signals within 4 hours if they are urgent or within 7 days if less urgent
- drainage maintenance within 90 days if the enquiry meets intervention requirements

all other faults will be scheduled into their planned maintenance.

Your gas. Our network.

Gas Network Upgrade

SGN will be carrying out essential gas network upgrades in Horton Kirby and South Darenth. This work will ensure that a continued safe and reliable supply of gas is delivered to nearby homes and businesses and is part of a 30-year programme of work to replace old mains reaching the end of their useful lives, with new, reliable plastic pipe.

Contractor, WCB Utilities who are completing this project, will be starting work in September. This is a large project and estimate this will take approximately seven to eight months to complete.

To ensure safety, there will be a need to close roads around the excavations for the duration of the work. The closure points will move along each road as work progresses. Vehicle access will be maintained for residents and businesses, but the route may change depending on where the closure point is. Teams will liaise with affected residents to advise of changes to access routes. Signed diversions will be in place for affected motorists where roads are closed.

Pedestrian and cycle access will not be affected, although cyclists must dismount and walk through the work area.

Start dates for phases three onwards will be confirmed with advance warning signs on each road in turn.

Phase one – Franks Lane, Horton Kirby - Replacing pipes in sections along the full length of the road.

Phase two – Eglantine Lane, Horton Kirby – Replacing pipes in sections from the junction with Franks Lane to the junction with Rays Hill

Phase three – Rays Hill, Horton Kirby– Replacing pipes along the full length of the road.


Phase four – The Street, Horton Kirby – Replacing pipes along the full length of the road.

Phase five – School Lane, Horton Kirby – Replacing pipes from the junction with Forge Lane to outside number 82 School Lane. With a need to temporarily close Churchill Road while working near its junction with School Lane.

SGN understand roadworks can be frustrating and are sorry for any inconvenience caused. SGN have planned this work to be completed during the school summer holiday period to try to reduce the disruption as much as possible.

The new plastic pipe has a lifespan of 80 years. This means that once our work is done, Horton Kirby and South Darenth residents and businesses will be able to enjoy the benefits of a safe and reliable supply of gas for many years to come.

The Queen in New Road, South Darenth, was named after Queen Victoria in whose reign it originated as a beer house. When Trevor Floyd took over as landlord in 1969 there was an entrance to an old Roman flint mine in the back garden. He used it for growing mushrooms but by 1994 it had been filled in. In 1988 The Queen extended down the hill into the shop that had been run by Mrs. Wickenden from 1946 until it closed in 1977. The Darent River Preservation Society

DRiPS held a delightful celebration to mark 40 years of the society. We were joined by supporters and friends from villages along the length of the river and enjoyed glorious weather and live music in the tranquil setting of The Quadrangle.

Our chairman, Stuart Merrylees welcomed the gathering and highlighted the problem of shifting baseline syndrome. This is the phenomenon describing how new generations look at depleted natural resources, such as pitiful river flow, and imagine that is normal and the baseline against which to measure further change. Former chairman, Huw Alban Davies described how the society helped to secure the £12 million Darent Action Plan which led water companies to reduce abstraction from local aquifers and other measures to increase the water in the river. He explained the importance of having a strong scientific basis to the campaign as well as support and publicity generated within the local community. This was an important reminder as we face further challenges ahead to preserve the health and future of our chalk stream against threats from a proposed sewage plant on the river and the ongoing problem of low flows

Would you like to get involved with activity sessions to help remove invasive species from the riverbank, restore riverbanks using traditional techniques, take part in river quality monitoring initiatives or other activities? Please keep an eye on our Facebook page for news of activities.

Please be alert to too good to be true investment opportunities on social media, which have celebrity endorsements. Criminals will use Artificial Intelligence to impersonate famous people and lead you to believe that these are genuine opportunities, when in fact they are a scam.

A red flag in all these cases is the promise of a high, market-beating return on your cash that cannot be obtained anywhere else.

How to protect yourself from Financial Investment fraud –

- Investment opportunities: Do not be rushed into making an investment. Remember, legitimate organisations will never pressure you into investing on the spot.
- Seek advice first: Before making significant financial decisions, speak with trusted friends or family members, or seek professional independent advice.
