Parish Council News

There has unfortunately been a spate of anti-social behaviour causing vandalism throughout the village within the past few months.

The bridge at Franks Lane has been vandalised twice following KCC undertaking works to reinstate it. KCC structure team will undertake some short-term safety measures and then review how best to proceed. CCTV has been discussed but unfortunately KCC only provide cameras in relation to fly tipping. Criminal damage issues are led by the Police. Cllr Roger Gough is proposing to bring together the various organisations involved to plan the next steps.

There has been some vandalism to trees being cut down in the 100 Year Wood (this is located between Westminster Field and the A225). Gill Tripp's bench has been vandalised and only remnants of the bench remain. The signage and posts have been removed.

During November there was damage to Heathside field suspected to be caused by unauthorised riding of motorbikes and quad bikes.

If anyone has any information, please do report to the police and inform the Parish Office.

At the November Parish Council meeting, Nick Gurr was co-opted as a new Parish Councillor. This means we now have eight Parish Councillors and there is still space for one more. If you are interested in volunteering for your local community and helping to make a difference, please do contact the parish office.

There are some available allotment plots. Please do contact the Parish Clerk if you would like to rent one or would like further information.

What is a Precept?

The precept is a tax that Parish Council's charge their local electors to meet their budget requirements. Parish Councils do not receive any direct funding from central government and rely on their precept plus any other income they generate from services or facilities they provide. The Parish Council precept is part of the Council Tax and is collected from local electors via their Council Tax payments. The precept requirement is the difference between the Parish Council's estimated income and its anticipated spending requirements for the financial year (its budget). The financial year runs from 1st April to 31st March. The Parish Council needs to agree a budget before it can set its precept, and both must be agreed by the full Parish Council. When calculating the precept, the Parish Council takes into consideration current year's spending levels for ongoing services for which it is responsible e.g. recreation facilities, village hall, streetlights, cemeteries, insurance and cost of the parish office, costs of any additional spending plans or projects, provision for contingencies and reserves, and levels of anticipated income.

Once a precept has been approved by the Parish Council. They inform Sevenoaks District Council, and it is then added to residents' council tax bills.

Part of the precept calculation is the 'Band D equivalent' Band D is the middle band of council tax paid on an average property in the area. The Band D equivalent provides a measure which allows precepts among councils of different sizes to be compared. The estimated number of Band D equivalent properties in the tax base is notified to the Parish Council by SDC prior to the precept setting exercise. The required precept is divided by the number of houses in the tax base to get the Band D equivalent.

The precept request for Horton Kirby and South Darent Parish Council for April 2025-March 2026 is £154,133. The Parish Council portion on your council tax bill for an average band D property will equate to £117.41 per year, £2.25 per week.

HORTON KIRBY AND SOUTH DARENTH PARISH COUNCIL GRANTS FOR LOCAL ORGANISATIONS

In December each year, the Parish Council awards grants, at its discretion, to community organisations who demonstrate a clear need for financial support. The organisation must be either non-profit making or charitable. The organisation will normally be expected to have clearly written aims and objectives, a written constitution and membership rules, copies of which should be submitted as part of the application.

The Council only award grants where the use or purpose of the grant benefits Horton Kirby and South Darenth and its residents. The benefit could include but is not limited to providing a service and/or providing activities and/or enhancing the quality of life.

Each application is assessed on its own merits. However, to ensure as fair a distribution as possible of available funds, the Council will take into account the amount and frequency of any previous awards. Due account may also be taken of the extent to which funding has been sought or secured from other sources or fundraising activities.

Grants have been awarded for December 2024 as follows:

- Horton Kirby Cricket Club - £250 to replace broken patio furniture for the enjoyment of home and away teams as well as visitors
- Horton Kirby Bowls Club - £250 for chairs and replacement hedging
- St Mary's Society of Bellringers - £500 towards the cost of protection equipment of the bell ropes and a new flag
- Darent River Preservation Society (DRIPS) - £500 for river testing and processing kit and volunteer supervision days.

Solar Farm Developments

Within Horton Kirby and South Darenth Parish boundaries

Horton Wood The developer is currently working on the planning conditions attached to the new consent. These and the remaining pre-commencement conditions under the original consent remain the developer's priority and this will dictate when the project can physically commence construction. They are still targeting the summer of 2025. However, this is the current estimate and the actual programme start date is yet to be confirmed. (See map1 hatched black and labelled HORTON WOOD approved).

Chimmens Farm This planning application was rejected by SDC. However, an appeal has now been lodged. Residents and organisations that made comments on the original planning application will be contacted directly by the reviewing inspectorate (see map1 hatched yellow and labelled CHIMMENS SF PROPOSAL)

Within neighbouring Parishes


Gabrielspring Wood This development is in Farningham jurisdiction and is significantly smaller than other developments in being about 40acres (see map1 hatched blue and labelled W GAB G W) and is awaiting an SDC planning decision.

Dean Bottom Solar Farm The proposed development is in Fawkham jurisdiction and of a similar size to the Horton Wood array. The developers proposed a consultation presentation, however, to date this has not taken place and there has not been a formal planning application. (See map1 hatched pink and labelled DB)

New Ash Green Solar Farm The proposed development is in Ash-Cum-Ridley jurisdiction and of a similar size to the Horton Wood array being approx. 200 acres (see map 2) A consultation presentation was made to Ash-Cum-Ridley PC on the 13th November. Awaiting formal planning application.

Can you volunteer to drive for our local Community Car scheme?

Having established a community transport scheme in Farningham and Eynsford to help people with journeys to health and social care appointments, we are keen to extend this resource to Horton Kirby and South Darenth.

The project consists of two parts:

- a voluntary car scheme (where volunteers use their own vehicles to transport residents local to the area, and are reimbursed at the government approved rate of 45p per mile)
- access to a specially adapted wheelchair accessible vehicle which is owned and run by the scheme with help from a government grant and ongoing sponsorship from BJ Motors (White Post Garage, Farningham).

Since the scheme was launched last summer, we have enrolled sixteen volunteer drivers and over forty residents from Eynsford and Farningham, and we have provided over one hundred journeys to hospitals, primary care practices and other health and social care settings.

Before launching the scheme in Horton Kirby and South Darenth we need to establish a pool of local volunteers who can support both the voluntary car scheme and drive the wheelchair accessible vehicle. Volunteers are added to a WhatsApp group, where the coordinator posts transport requests, and drivers can respond to as many or as few journeys according to your circumstances.



The Darent River Preservation Society

Early inhabitants gave the river its name – Derva, the ‘oak river’.

This was enlarged by the Romans to Derventio, the ‘river of oak trees’.

The chalk river – whose name originates from prolific oak trees that crowded its banks – rises in the Greensand Hills south of Westerham and runs for 21 miles through the Darent Valley to join the Thames at the Dartford marshes.

Once navigable in flat-bottomed boats as far upstream as Lullingstone, and with sufficient force to power up to 30 mills along its length, today’s river has been left on the brink.

Continuing over-abstraction by water companies, a changing climate and pollution threaten its survival – and that of the wildlife it sustains.

Join us and connect with people and organisations who are working to safeguard the future of the river.

Every river is special, but the Darent’s status as a chalk river marks it out further. Chalk streams – of which only around 200 exist – are unique to England and north-west Europe. They derive most of their flow from underground aquifers which, together with the chalk landscape, give these rivers a gentle quality with their own aesthetic and ecological characteristics.

Our tireless lobbying put the plight of the Darent on the political agenda. In the first 15 years since DRiPS formed, no fewer than 20 reports were written about the river’s low flow by bodies such as the National Rivers Authority, Thames Water and the Environment Agency.

As the current guardians of the river, we need to safeguard its future and improve its condition for future generations. Together, we can make a difference.

The Weir at Westminster Field

We are aware of the problems in the UK and around the world. Everyday news concerning the environment is in the media. Some of it is very alarming. But let us turn to our Parish of Horton Kirby and South Darent. The Darent runs through our Parish. The river and its controlling structures require maintenance. There are weirs further up the Darent and there is our weir at Westminster Field. This one does need urgent repairs and should be carried out in late summer when the river flow is at its lowest. Now the river level is exceptionally high, and repairs cannot be done. A detailed visual inspection of the weir was carried out on 9th December 2024 by me and District Councillor Alan White. We are grateful to the residents of Millen Court for giving us permission to do this. We could only see what was above the water as the river is in its high winter flow. The sluice controls could still be used but are not connected. The sluices are set in a fixed position regardless of river flow or volume. The last time the sluice gates were renewed was in 1990 according to records. Inspection and repairs are now overdue.

The central pier needs repair. The brickwork urgently needs repointing. Water is leaking into the internal parts of the structure. The fixed concrete overflow to the right looking upstream from the bridge still looks good. The weir is part of Millen Court estate and is theirs to look after. However, the weir is part of our heritage and needs attention very soon. So, when you cross the bridge into Westminster Field, look upstream and marvel at the engineering of years gone by. It is worth preserving and needs your help.

On a different note, we ask the Environment Agency to clear vegetation from the river in the Parish. This has not been done for over 20 years. There are blockages which need removing to prevent flooding downstream from Westminster Field.



David and Vivienne have a very long association with South Darenth with David having grown up in the village with his family here. We are thrilled to welcome them into church life here!

In honour of Ben and Gwen Dawes for their love and faithfulness

Ben Dawes retired officially in September having been preparing for a few years to retire, plans that were put on hold following the very sad passing of his wife Gwen in 2023. He and Gwen pastored the Church for 28 years, leading the Sunday worship, Sunday school, after school Buzz Club, and Women's Fellowship. Christmas 'Love in a Box' gifts, support for missionaries abroad, gifts for Oasis Women's refuge and more were regular features of their ministry. Despite his retirement Ben was still leading Carol singing just last month in the Jolly Millers much to everyone's enjoyment. Ben and Gwen also guided the church into its own Trusteeship under the Church Growth Trust in 2013, ensuring the building will remain in Christian service for years to come. They instigated the extension to the front of the building which incorporated accessible toilets and entrance to the hall. The kitchen was also overhauled to enable catering for events such as the Harvest Suppers and Christmas dinners. Last year we had a memorable Passover Meal as well. 
