What does the Parish Council do?

Horton Kirby and South Darenth Parish Council is made up of nine Councillors who live locally. They are voted into their posts by the electorate of the Parish, or co-opted, to form a Council whose role it is to make decisions in the interests of the local community. Councillors are not paid but volunteer their time to serve our villages. Parish Council meetings are open to the public and the minutes, which record the business and decisions, can be found on the Council's website. You can also read them in the Parish Office.

The Parish Council receives a precept (an amount of money) from Sevenoaks District Council which is collected as part of your Council Tax. With this money the Parish Council pays for many of the facilities that we enjoy as a community and for which it has responsibility.

The Parish Council owns and maintains the following land and buildings: The Village Hall and Jubilee Hall, Heathside, Westminster Field, the Pavilion in Westminster Field, including the public toilets and the Hundred Year Wood on the left of the pathway approaching the Dartford Road. The burial ground opposite St Mary's Church, Paper Mill Green in South Darenth, allotment site and area next to Wide Horizons. We have adopted areas of responsibility for the play areas at Saxon Place and Shrubbery Road and are currently undertaking a 12 month trial of cutting the KCC owned verges, to avoid a reduction in the number of cuts.

Some pathways are maintained by the Parish Council but the majority are either looked after by Kent County Council or private landowners. Dog bins and regular emptying is paid for by the Parish Council.

There are 97 streetlights and their running costs fall under the Parish Council's care across the Parish with others being maintained by KCC or local management groups.

All this responsibility does mean that the Council is kept busy ensuring their administration is executed properly and within budget, whilst keeping abreast with changes and plans from District and County statutory bodies such as Sevenoaks District Council, Kent County Council and Kent Police.

You are always welcome to attend meetings, visit or call the Parish Office or get in touch with your local Councillors with ideas, concerns or information that you feel is important. Agendas for meetings are placed on notice boards at least three working days before a meeting. These boards can be found outside the Parish Office, on the Green in South Darenth and near the entrance to Westminster Field in Horton Kirby. Dates for upcoming meetings and agendas can also be found on the website.

Could you be a Parish Councillor? Next year (2019) elections will be taking place so please register your interest with the Parish Clerk if you would consider standing.

Precept costs

This year the Parish Council precept request for 2018/19 is £103,672. Using the Estimated Council Tax Base of £1,298.26 this equates to a rise of only £3.45 each household for the year based on a Band D property.

Report from the Recreation and Open Spaces Committee



The year has started with great success as the new playground at Heathside was officially opened on Saturday 27th January 2018. The opening concluded 18 months of many hours of hard work with planning, surveys and then developing.

We are now in discussions for the next phase for Heathside that could include an outdoor gym, lighting, car park and toilets.

In the coming months there will be new semi-mature trees planted at Heathside and at Westminster Field. These are to replace trees that have been removed due to storm damage, age or disease.

The pavilion at Westminster Field has had some remedial works, including an electrical upgrade and repair work to the roof and guttering, while feasibility studies are being carried out on the current car park.

We are discussing upgrading the equipment at Shrubbery Road playground, as replacement parts are now obsolete due to their age. However, as many of you will be aware, the Parish Council does not own this land and therefore it was put forward by Sevenoaks District Council for their 'call for sites'. Until we know for definite the outcome from this survey we are reluctant to spend your money on upgrading any of the equipment.

I am pleased to report that, since our purchase of the allotments, all the plots are now rented and the land adjoining has been leased to Wide Horizons. If you would like to be considered for an allotment plot, then please contact the Parish office to be added to the waiting list.

Street Lights – LED replacements in future

After consultation, the Parish Council has considered LED replacements for its 97 street lights. It has decided to replace existing lights with LED when a current light fails. Consideration was given to replacing all the lights with LED at one time but the saving on energy costs would not outweigh the cost of buying replacement lights for several years. KCC have already replaced all their lights with LED in the Parish, having economy of scale and greater savings across Kent to justify the expense.

News from the Village Hall and Jubilee Hall

There will be a change for the damage deposit for children's parties (children aged 12 and under) – this will now be £50. All the other damage deposit charges will remain the same.

From 1st April the cleaning of the Village Hall and Jubilee Hall will be undertaken by May Harris (a multi-service company). The current contractor (Mark Ginno) did not wish to renew the contract but we thank him for his hard work over the past few years.

The Befriender's Group, which meets in the Jubilee Hall on a Tuesday afternoon, held a very successful and enjoyable Christmas lunch for the members on 15th December 2017. Good comments were received about the quality of the food in particular and the friendly chat!

Agricultural Waste Digester and ancillary infrastructure at Court Lodge Farm, Stack Road, Horton Kirby, DA4 9DU

Application to set up an anaerobic digestion system of up to 37,000 tonnes per annum of agricultural waste.

What is an Agricultural Waste Digester?

Anaerobic digestion is a natural biological process whereby organic material (feedstock) is broken down by bacteria, in the absence of oxygen. The feedstock is fed into the fermenter tanks, where this digestion process is optimised and controlled. The resultant, digested product is a bio fertiliser which separates into a liquid and solid fraction. The liquid fraction is stored in the lagoon.

Once digested (typically 40 days) the plant produces an inert digestate fertiliser/soil conditioner consisting of indigestible material. The volume of digestate is typically around 90-95% of what was fed into the digester. 1A by-product of this process is the production of combustible biomethane which can be exported to the national grid for renewable energy generation. Onocoland intend to use this biogas to power Court Lodge Farm and export any excess gas to the national grid.

The proposed AWD will utilise all existing agricultural waste from the farm estates including; farmyard manure, slurry, straw (a waste product of wheat production) and rye grass. Hence, it provides a full agricultural waste solution for Onocoland Ltd.

Why here?

Court Lodge Farm is the chosen location for the AWD due to its location for key inputs i.e. farmyard manure from the beef and dairy followers cattle that are going to be present on site but also its shared borders and farm tracks with the adjacent Gay Dawn Farm which will minimise on road vehicle movements. There will be no traffic movements associated with moving farm yard manure from the farm yard at Court Lodge Farm and the AWD given its immediate proximity.

What about transport and road use?

It is proposed that maize, rye grass and straw from Gay Dawn Farm will be transported almost entirely on internal farm tracks through shared boundaries with Court Lodge Farm thereby negating the need for road movements except for very short stretches.

Some of the Maize will be grown at West Kingsdown (part of Bower Park farm) and transported to Court Lodge via Gay Dawn Farm in Longfield. This is estimated to generate up to 200 farm vehicle movements per year. It is however considered that this will be offset by the current 196 farm vehicles (392 two way movements) from Gay Dawn Farm to West Kingsdown as part of the current transport of wheat, straw, and fertiliser to storage facilities at West Kingsdown which would become obsolete as part of the proposed development. The planned route will be via A20, A225, Station Road, Horton Road and Jacobs Lane by tractor towing and will avoid peak times as much as possible.

Slurry from Bower Park Farm, West Kingsdown will be transported to Court Lodge Farm via sealed slurry tanker. It is anticipated that this will generate approximately 550 journeys to Court Lodge Farm per year (approximately 1.5 journeys per day or 11 per week). Movement of Glycerol is predicted to generate 50 trips per year but offset on the wider road network by the decrease in road movements associated with the current extent of imported fertiliser.

It is proposed that as and when digestate fertiliser is required at West Kingsdown, these trips will be co-ordinated with the trips to deliver slurry to Court Lodge Farm and therefore negate the need for additional road movements.

There will be no traffic movements associated with moving slurry/farm yard manure from the farm yard at Court Lodge Farm and the AWD given its immediate proximity.

There are no anticipated regular vehicle movements associated with the export of gas to the grid post construction.

Given the volume of traffic associated with the proposed development it is not considered that it will affect the capacity of the local road network.

No significant traffic and transport related effects are therefore considered likely to result from the proposed development.

What about the smell?

The proposed AWD is likely to result in a beneficial effect to odour across Oncoland's estate. Manure piles in fields will no

longer be required and all agricultural waste is to be transport to the AWD in sealed tankers and then transposed into sealed fermenter tanks and subsequently the sealed lagoon.

Furthermore the AWD will negate the need for storage of 'raw' slurry in open pits and for the spreading of 'raw' slurry and farmyard manure.

The result of the AD process is inert odourless compost that will be spread on the land and the contained biomethane gas by-product that will generate electricity for Court Lodge Farm with all excess gas contained and exported to the national grid

The proposed development will not therefore result in significant adverse odour related effects.

Is this a flood risk area?

The Environment Agency (EA) online flood-mapping tool shows the site to be in flood zone 1 (at low risk from flooding). No inundation of the site by flood waters into the silage clamps or AWD is therefore likely, particularly given the sites elevated position.

Will it be noisy?

The AWD is not a significant noise generating installation by virtue of its reliance on micro-organisms in sealed containers to decompose the feed stock and therefore significant noise related effects are not anticipated. There will be a small generator on site required as part of the AWD but this will be housed in an insulated plant room such that the acoustic treatments of the plant room can easily achieve the noise levels

set out in the WHO guidelines at the closest residential receptor (New House, farm managers accommodation).

What about risk to human health?

The likely significant health impacts of the proposed development are considered to be dust related air quality effects, noise and groundwater.

As stated under the relevant headings above no significant effects subject to the mitigation set out will occur on human health from air quality, noise or groundwater effects resultant from the proposed development.

Studies have found that "digesting farm manure reduces nearly 90% of the usual greenhouse gas emissions caused by conventional farm manure as the plant is a sealed system, capturing all gases.

What about the laying of pipework and extra traffic caused by delivery?

There will be a one off HGV delivery of the pipework

Will the site get bigger?

There are no plans to increase the existing proposals

What about the effect on the green belt?

The elevation will not be higher than the existing bard and screened by hedging.

Role of the Parish Council in planning applications

Parish councils must be notified of, and display for residents, any planning applications for the area. Any comments submitted to the planning authority by the parish council must be taken into account. In planning terms it is regrettable to say that, despite the Localism Act, most Local Planning Authorities treat Parish Councils as a single individual (just as you or any other individual person) when it comes to assessing public interest in planning applications - irrespective of how many people they actually represent. Therefore, the Parish Council urges parishioners to register their own views with Kent County Council via their website. www.kent.gov.uk/waste-planning-and-land/planning-applications/look-at-planning-applications

Your objection will have more effect if a number of people write in to object, but do not be tempted to organise a petition; it will not carry any weight and is a waste of time. Also avoid using a 'standard' letter. Objectors should use their own words and write, type or word process their letters themselves. Objections will not carry the same weight if they are seen to have been written or produced in a standardised form.

DRiPS news from Malcolm Dunn

I am happy to report that our river is flowing well. Rain over Christmas and the New Year, plus recent days, has raised flow and volume and can be classified as exceptional.

Heavy rain between 19th and 24th January inclusive has boosted the river. Rainfall measurements over this time - 250mm or 10 inches. Previously flow and volume was just meeting average with no improvement in sight. Reports are coming in of excellent flow in other locations in the valley.

No doubt all areas of Kent will see the benefit. Bewl reservoir was in serious trouble and was only 36% full! This recent rainfall was much needed and a welcome boost to the county water supplies.

FLOOD WARDENS

Thank you to Julian Rowley for his volunteering as one of the parish flood wardens these last two years. If you would like to take on this role in his place please contact Heather at the Parish Office. The role involves keeping an eye on water levels periodically and reporting any issues with the river to the Environment Agency or the Clerk to alert land owners. In the event of a flood, the wardens would help assist with any emergency plans from Sevenoaks District Council and call for sand bags etc. Janet Fitzpatrick and Heather Rohard are also flood wardens. A Horton Kirby resident near the river would be a welcome addition to covering the Parish.

TREES, TREES, TREES

It is with sadness that we report that the Field Maple in Westminster Field, a long standing feature by the footpath, has become diseased and must be felled. As this is in a conservation area permission has been sought and granted by Sevenoaks District Council for the work to be carried out. A semi-mature Field Maple will be planted close by in February as a replacement.

Semi mature spring flowering trees will also be planted in Heathside in February for visitors to enjoy this year.

YOUR DOG’S POO COULD RESULT IN KILLING A CALF

In the last six month’s one local dairy farmer has lost 26 baby calves all because of dog’s poo.

Neospora caninum is a parasite-type organism which can infect grazing cattle.

It is carried in the faeces of dogs.

Cows grazing on pastures contaminated by faeces from dogs are susceptible.

When the parasite is in a pregnant cow it can cause an abortion of the calf.

There is now evidence of an increase in our valleys.

But there are no licensed drugs or vaccines available for the cows.

There is NO evidence to suggest *Neospora* can infect or harm humans.

The impact of infection can be catastrophic on any dairy herd causing large numbers of cows to abort and leading to inevitable financial loss.

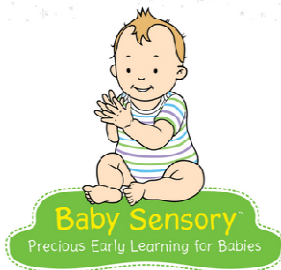

Senior Team We have signed a full squad of 18 players. We were promoted this season but have additional support for training and everyone is working hard to achieve maximum results.

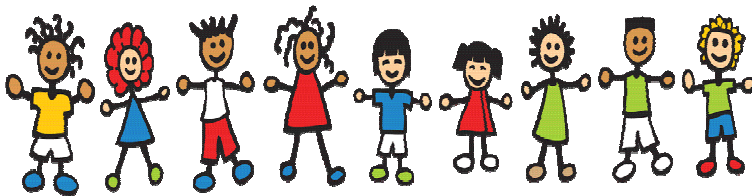

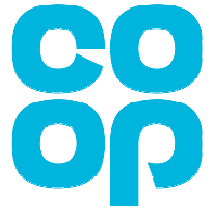
