## Message from Cllr Peter Rushbrook Chair HKSD Parish Council

#### Dear Residents

With January gone we can start looking forward to some better weather and a chance to get outside and enjoy our villages and everything they have to offer. Lots of work has been going on around our green spaces of which we are now moving forward to register them all into the "Fields in Trust scheme" which will safeguard their future against any change so that we and families can all enjoy these most vital green spaces. As mentioned in my last letter that was posted on the notice boards the council have been looking into EV points for owners of electric cars, two points in the village hall and at Westminster Field have had the main cabinets and bases put in and we are just waiting for the charging points themselves to be installed.

We have managed to limit the precept increase this year to 2% which means that a Band D tax household will be paying £83.59 per year, which works out to £1.60 per week . This is a tiny increase of £1.54 per year or .029p per week.

Plans for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee are well on the way and I would like to thank Cllr Stewart and the working party for taking on this mammoth task. The Parish Council will be hosting an event on Thursday 2nd June, the first bank holiday of the long weekend, culminating with the lighting of the beacon at 9.45pm.

To finish I would like to remind everyone that you are all welcome to come to the Parish council meetings held on the first Monday of every month, and if you would like to put your name down to volunteer for any of the work days, then please drop a message to us.

## **Report from the Halls Committee**

It is good to report that some sort of normality is returning and that many of our regular hirers have reopened since lockdown has eased and both halls are now being used once again. There is a wide range of activities taking place, including a variety of keep fit/exercise classes, sporting activities (Kung Fu, Martial Arts & Table Tennis clubs) and groups for young people including Riverside Nursery, Heartbeeps and Sutton at Hone Brownies. The regular village societies have also returned.

By the time that this newsletter is published the floor in the Village Hall will have had its annual scrub and polish and the alterations to storage in the Jubilee Hall will have been completed. The table & chair storage area in the Jubilee Hall has become the secure home for the storage of office documents and files while the chair/table storage has moved to the other alcove. WiFi is in the process of being installed, the internal fire doors are being checked and both a lighting and a fire risk survey are booked. The Green Room continues to be used for the storage of equipment by our regular hirers.

However, after much deliberation, the Halls Committee has had to increase the hire charges for both halls. This is the first increase for several years but with escalating running costs such as cleaning, maintenance and heating/lighting there really was no other option. The higher charges for the halls is the only way to keep the parish precept down for 2022-2023. The new rates will come in from 1st April this year.

#### Report from the Recreation and Open Spaces Committee

The working party has been making fantastic ground with the Lower Paddock in order to prepare it for the sowing of the wild flower seeds in the spring. The bulbs have emerged and once they are in full bloom will make an amazing display at the woodland entrance.

The Parish Council unanimously agreed that all its' owned land is to be registered with the Fields In Trust and that enforces our vision of protecting our green spaces against development and, incorporating the Lower Paddock, Top Paddock and the river path to form part of a longer walk with the aid of signage, which the Parish Council is seeking funding for.

If you would like to help with this amazing project to enhance the villages that you live in, then the working party currently meets every Saturday morning at the Holmesdale Road entrance to the Lower Paddock from 10am. More volunteers would be greatly welcomed.

Wild flower seeds will also be sown along the path in Westminster Field to enhance the visual impact when the Cherry Trees are in bloom.

We will also be planting four silver birches in Papermill Green to replace the loss of the sycamore tree and planting saplings received from the Woodland Trust to form hedges in the Lower Paddock, Top Paddock and Allotments.

Repairs to the trim trail at Heathside are in progress, starting with the Burma Bridge.

There are many projects that we have on-going and when they have been finalised we can provide you with another update.

## **Parish Council Precept**

#### What is a Precept?

The Precept is a tax that Parish Council's charge their local electors to meet their budget requirements. Parish Councils do not receive any direct funding from central government and rely on their Precept plus any other income they generate from services or facilities they provide. The Parish Council Precept is part of the Council Tax and is collected from local electors via their Council Tax payments.

How is it Calculated? The Precept requirement is the difference between the Parish Council's estimated income and its anticipated spending requirements for the financial year (its budget). The financial year runs from 1st April to 31st March. The Parish Council needs to agree a budget before it can set its Precept and both must be agreed by the full Parish Council. When calculating the Precept, the Parish Council takes into consideration: current year's spending levels - for ongoing services for which it is responsible e.g. recreation facilities, lighting, cemeteries, insurance and cost of the Parish Office, costs of any additional spending plans or projects, provision for contingencies and reserves, levels of anticipated income – from services for which it is responsible e.g. rental income, allotment fees, burial fees, grants.

Once a Precept has been approved by the Parish Council, they inform SDC and it is then added to residents Council Tax bills. SDC pays the Precept to the Parish Council in two instalments (Apr and Sept).

The 2022/23 budget as prepared by the Responsible Financial Officer and reviewed by the committees and members was ratified. The Precept request for this period shall be £106,829.

**News from Matthew Scott: Kent's Police and Crime Commissioner** 

## Kent PCC budget plan launched

Kent's Police and Crime Commissioner Matthew Scott has today launched his budget, to make the force fit for the future and protect the service residents of Kent say they want.

Thanks to a combination of council tax payer support and extra funding from the Government's Uplift Programme, police officer numbers have risen by 788 since 2016. Kent will soon have 3970 officers, with a further 185 to be recruited by March 2023.

The county now has specialist teams working in both urban and rural communities, a dedicated squad to reduce burglary and another to tackle drug dealing gangs. These teams are producing results and the Commissioner wants to build on their success.

As part of the budget Kent will receive £230.5 million from central government, but in real terms this is still a decrease of 16.6% since 2010/11. To cover some of that shortfall the Commissioner is proposing to increase the local council tax police precept by just 84 pence per month, or £10 a year for an average Band D property. Savings of over £8 million will still need to be made across the Force. The Budget will be voted on by Kent and Medway Police and Crime Panel early next month.

Matthew Scott says,

"If the first phase of my plan was to rebuild, the next phase is to make the Force fit for the future. I'm proud to have delivered an additional 788 police officers to Kent and I'm asking for your support to help us grow and invest further.

The Budget I announce today will include dealing with unprecedented inflationary challenges, funding for 185 more Police Officers and the support required to deliver this. Investment will begin in police stations in Maidstone, Sittingbourne, Folkestone, Tonbridge and further investment in Ashford. A new digital evidence system that will allow dash cam uploads. And there will be a further expansion of our cadet programmes.

To deliver this, I have had to make hard decisions. And I appreciate that times are tough. But in return for this plan, I am asking you to pay just short of 84 pence per month more in your council tax. £10.00 for the whole year. We will also need to make further efficiencies to deliver a balanced budget, which will be tough, but will be done in a managed way.

We are turning a corner. Numbers are rising. Outcomes are improving. Crime is falling.

I hope you can support me in this task again."

The Budget plan will be voted on by Kent and Medway Police and Crime Panel on the 2<sup>nd</sup> February.

In the recent Police and Crime Plan Survey, 82% of respondents agreed with the Commissioner's priorities for Kent Police. Last year Kent had the 8<sup>th</sup> lowest police precept rate in the country.

If this budget is approved a Band D house would pay £228.15 a year for the police.

## St Mary's Horton Kirby, Parish church for South Darenth, Southdowns and Horton Kirby and part of the Darent Valley Benefice with St John's Sutton-at-Hone and St Margaret's Darenth



You may have missed the star shining out over the parish from the top of the church tower over the last two Christmases: it has kindly been hosted by The Bull pub instead while works to restore a flagpole and weathervane to the top of St Mary's tower have been progressed. It is always and inevitably a lengthy process to undertake works on a Grade II\* listed building and at such height. But now a new and lighter weathervane and flagpole have been installed, the culmination of invested time, labour and expertise. Grateful thanks to all who have made this possible, especially to Malcolm and Linda Green and to Anne Williams, and to those who have worked on the building with great care and attention.

Sunday services continue at 10am, alternately at St Mary's and at St Margaret's Darenth for the time being. A new(ish) project has been the re-introduction of a regular Junior Church (think Sunday School but with parents and children sharing the session together); this takes place every Sunday at 10am in the church hall at St Margaret's Darenth. If you would like to develop regular participation in the life of a church community with your young children, this is a really engaging and stress-free way to do it! The sessions run for an hour with some free play and space to get to know each other, plus games, activities and Christian teaching. Currently the age range of children attending is twelve months to around eight years old.

By the time this newsletter is distributed, Mothering Sunday, Holy Week and Easter will not be too far off. ## **Our Green Valley**

The Darent is 21 miles long. It starts in Westerham and finishes in the Thames near Dartford.

Much has been written on the Darent and today I Googled The Darent River Preservation Society. There is a wealth of information on this site.

This spring, we intend to complete our walk from start to finish and cover the 21 miles. A health check you could say. So far we have walked from Westerham to Shoreham. There is no complete path and on occasions we have had to divert onto roads then back onto the riverside. We have met many ramblers on occasions. It's a popular walk. There are plans to improve the path including repairs to the path in this Parish. It's muddy with potholes at the moment.

#### NORTH VERSUS SOUTH KENT

Recently, there has been more rain in South Kent than North Kent and the data bears this out. The Darent has had normal flow since autumn began. As expected it was low in summer 2021 but nothing alarming. Recharge to the aquifer at the moment - end of January- is less than than it should be. It's too early to say what the result will be, but January 2022 has been much drier than expected. Rain please.

#### THE WIDER PICTURE

To prevent water shortage in the years ahead, plans are being drawn up for the benefit of South East England. When housing expansion goes ahead coupled with climate change, now is the time for action.

- 1. It has been proposed to link the River Severn with the Thames via a new pipeline or restore an existing canal.
- 2. Transfer Thames Water to Southern Water using existing arrangements or new ones.
- 3. Water transfer from the Midlands to the South East using the existing Grand Union Canal

So, there is much going on in the background. Also, Thames Water - our supplier- has been instructed to reduce leaks. 20% is lost . This is much too high. To reduce this will take some time but it has to be done. Some of the pipework dates back to Victorian times.

As I mentioned in my last report the Aquifer Storage and Recovery project in our Parish is being tested and data collected. It is the most advanced project in the UK. An underground reservoir. This coupled with the measures listed above puts the South East in a good position to deal with what lies ahead
